STEPHEN MINISTRY

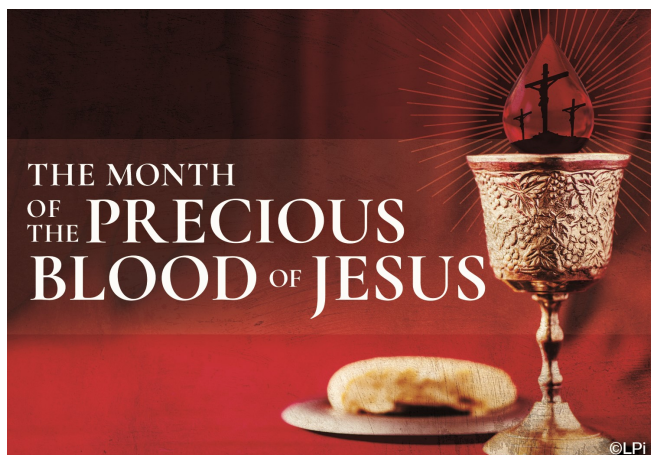

CREDO-CREED

Part 2

“For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man”.

At this point in our recitation of the creed, it is our tradition as Catholics to genuflect, especially at the two solemnities of the Annunciation and Christmas. In these two feasts we celebrate the Incarnation (moment of conception) and the birth (emergence into the physical world and becoming human). During the rest of the Sundays, we simply make a profound bow.

In the creed, what we declare of God the Father and God the Son, we also declare about God the Holy Spirit...I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. Holy Spirit is Lord. The Holy Spirit is the giver of life.

At our Baptism, through the Holy Spirit, we are given new life. We become daughters and sons of God. At Confirmation, we receive the inspiration and all the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit. We are “animated”, “encouraged” in the same way the disciples were in the upper room. The early church was strengthened and emboldened at the descent of the Holy Spirit.

At the feast of Pentecost, the church was born (given life) and down through the ages, the Holy Spirit continues to renew, refresh and re-invigorate the church and causes it to perdure.

...One Holy, Catholic and Apostolic. Our Catholic faith teaches us that Jesus founded the church and had it built in the 12 Apostles; The Holy Spirit gave it and continues to give it impetus and direction, makes it universal, since that very first Pentecost, that is comprising of every tongue, people and nation. No one, not a single person is excluded. However, everybody has the free will to exclude themselves.

“I believe in the resurrection of the of the Body and life everlasting...” Again, needless to say, another mystery! We, as Christians, model ourselves on Jesus’ resurrection and Mary’s assumption. We know that earthly life is good, full of terrific things, but it can also be terrible, full of horrible things. Some people die horribly, bodies destroyed beyond recognition. I can list some horrible ways, but I won’t, I know your imagination is up to the task.

On the other hand, in modern times, we are adopting this other way of disposing our human remains. It’s a cultural thing done in the East since the dawn of time. In the West, it’s becoming more popular, easier and cheaper. It’s called cremation. How will the resurrection of the body happen in this instance? Our faith says God will raise the living and the dead. How? Early church fathers, St. Augustine et al. struggled with this issue a lot. St. Paul had alluded to it in his letters. Some said “Everybody will be perfect in Heaven. How? They didn’t say. St. Augustine said that everybody would be the age of 33, the age at which Jesus died and rose from the deal. This would happen regardless of how or when the person died. Well, here we go again, trying to explain a mystery and it may just lead us into heresy, so we better stop right here!

One thing though – the church is clear on the importance of the body. If God chose to have a human body in the incarnation, after creating it in this particular way at the very beginning, it means the body is extra special in the scheme of things. We must therefore take very good care of it in this physical life. In 1 Cor 6:19 Paul reminds us that our body is the temple of the Holy Spirit (the Lord, the giver of life). There is an existence after the end of earthly life and we’ll have to go through judgement, so we can continue life through beatific vision (Bliss of the Kingdome of God) or through external damnation.

Finally, there are times when we do not recite the creed in the normal way. We do it through question and answer, especially at the Easter vigil, Easter Sunda, and during Baptisms. The questions cover 6 things. 3 questions that cover what we promise to “turn away” from, and the 3 affirmations we promise to turn towards in our Christian life.

That’s it for the creed. We will now turn our attention to the Universal Prayers, the Prayers of the Faithful or the Intercessions, whichever term you prefer.

Following the day's events, come to the Vigil Liturgy at 5:30 pm (optional).

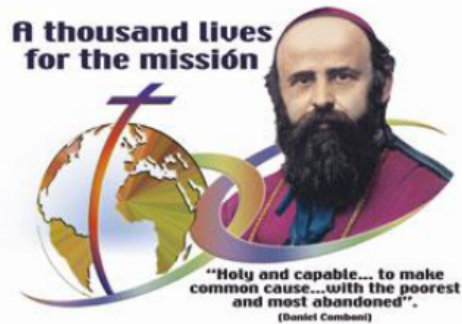

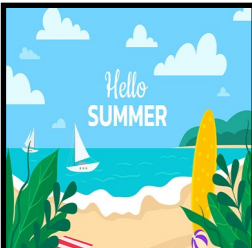
